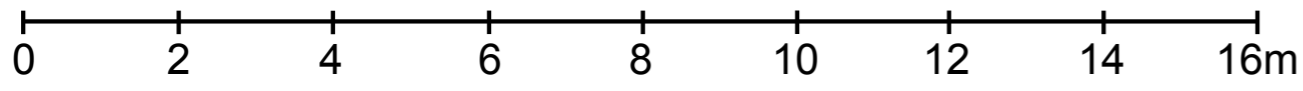
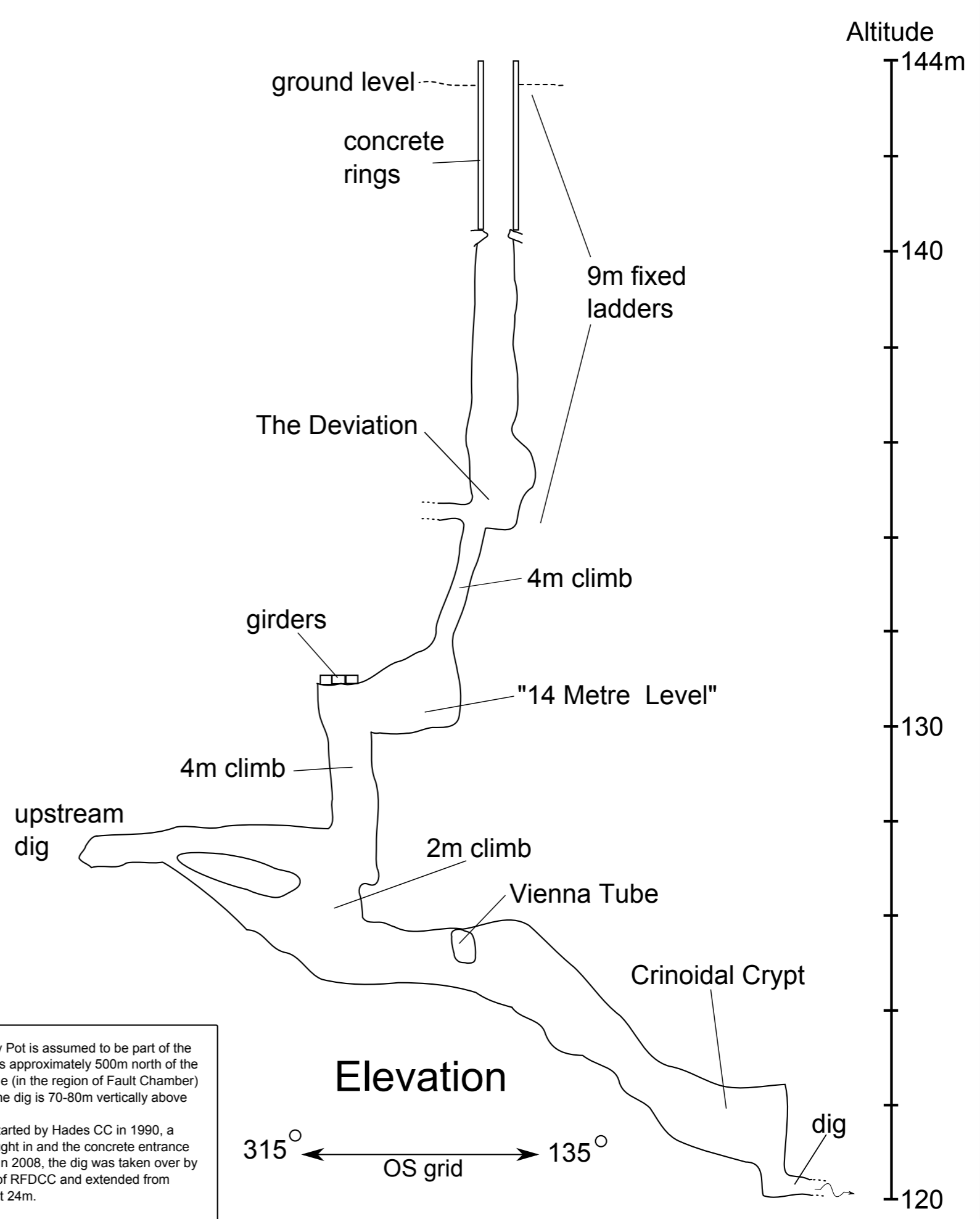


Plan

# Piccadilly Pot

**Background:** Piccadilly Pot is assumed to be part of the Otter Hole system. It lies approximately 500m north of the closest part of Otter Hole (in the region of Fault Chamber) and the lowest part of the dig is 70-80m vertically above that point.  
**History:** The dig was started by Hades CC in 1990, a Hymac digger was brought in and the concrete entrance rings installed in 1992. In 2008, the dig was taken over by the Chepstow Diggers of RFDCC and extended from 12m depth to its present 24m.
